I must thank the staff of the Centre for their dedicated efforts in carrying out various activities to alert the public to the disease. Let us work together to build a healthier and happier community!

Over the course of 2012, the Hong Kong Red Ribbon Centre has continued to carry out important and innovative work in the response to HIV, initiating a number of successful activities and initiatives. The Centre's work has driven progress on HIV prevention and treatment while building awareness and understanding amongst the public and policymakers. Working with partners in Hong Kong, mainland China, and the region, the Red Ribbon Centre has effectively promoted collaboration and experience sharing, building lasting bridges between partners from government, civil society, health care professionals and other key stakeholders.

Today, the majority of countries in the Asia-Pacific region have concentrated HIV epidemics, with HIV incidence and prevalence occurring primarily among key affected populations, including men who have sex with men (MSM), sex workers and people who inject drugs. The rapidly increasing epidemic amongst MSM is of particular concern, in Hong Kong, in mainland China and in the region as a whole, and requires particular attention.

Recognising this reality, the Red Ribbon Centre has implemented a number of campaigns and initiatives focussing on men who have sex with men. Capitalizing on the growing reach of mobile media, the Centre developed and launched a mobile application targeting young men who have sex with men, providing information on prevention and testing services. The Centre also hosted a special meeting of the MSM Working Group on HIV Prevention, looking at approaches to addressing the escalating HIV epidemic amongst MSM, and carried out training for Hong Kong healthcare staff on MSM health issues.

As part of its work to promote collaboration and experience sharing, the Centre participated in a staff exchange programme, receiving two officials from mainland China Departments of Health. Through the Centre's Lions Red Ribbon Fellowship Scheme, three Fellows were received from Harbin, Guangdong and Jiangsu. The Centre also organised a training workshop for NGO workers, building capacity around understanding of HIV and STIs.

The Hong Kong Red Ribbon Centre made an important contribution to strengthening public awareness around HIV in 2012. The Centre launched the World AIDS Campaign 2012 together with Hong Kong media partners and carried out a "Travel Save, Condoms Save Lives" promotional activity in various Hong Kong transport hubs, raising awareness around safe sex. Through these and numerous other activities, the Centre worked to engage the public and highlight important topics.

As we move into 2013, the deadline for the Millennium Development Goals continues to draw closer; bold action and strong leadership are needed if we are to achieve the goals we have set out to meet. As we strive to achieve the 2015 goals, we must also advocate to ensure that HIV and health remain central priorities on the post-2015 agenda. During this critical period, leadership and initiative from organisations such as the Hong Kong Red Ribbon Centre are essential. I am confident that the Hong Kong Red Ribbon Centre will continue to play a key role in these efforts, and I look forward to continuing to work closely with the Red Ribbon Centre in the years to come.

Director's report

2012 is a special year for Red Ribbon Centre. It marks the 15th anniversary of RRC since its opening in 1997. To commemorate this milestone in the history of RRC, an anniversary gathering was organized on 20 September. It was gratefully supported and joined by several key persons who have newly assumed their positions: Mrs Regina Leung, the Patron of Red Ribbon Centre, Dr Ko Wing Man, the Secretary for Food and Health, and Dr Constance Chan, the Director of Health. The gathering also turned out to be a home-coming and memorable event for many old friends and supporters of RRC, who have contributed enormously to the work and success of RRC over the years.

In the last year, RRC has continued to function as a public-health oriented HIV prevention and health promotion arm of the Department of Health, basing in the community and facing the society. It ran publicity campaigns, health promotional programmes as well capacity building activities in 2012. In responding to the moving edge of HIV epidemic in Hong Kong, efforts targeting men who have sex with men (MSM) infections has been one major focus of RRC work last year. A mobile application named "1069 試戴樂" was launched to provide information on access to free condom and HIV testing over the territory. This is because smart phone has become an instant and convenient platform for MSM to source sex partners in Hong Kong, similar to other places. The application was launched with the active participation of MSM community and non-governmental organisations. For a consecutive seven years, RRC collaborated with the Hong Kong Lesbian and Gay Film Festival to disseminate HIV prevention and safer sex messages for the MSM community. Apart from special screenings on HIV/AIDS films, a short announcement on "1069 試戴樂" was produced and screened at the Festival this year. To enhance the prevention efforts, RRC for the first time participated in the Hong Kong Pride Parade 2012 to raise HIV awareness, promote safer sex and encourage regular HIV testing among the MSM community. Parade by condom mascots and a game stall were among the activities engaged by RRC.

Red Ribbon Centre implemented a series of publicity and media activities around World AIDS Day to raise public awareness on HIV/AIDS and promote acceptance of people living with the virus. Jointly organized with the Radio Television Hong Kong Radio 2, a series of radio programmes was aired under the theme of "我接納 我關心". A MicroFilm titled "Love, Zero AIDS" was produced and a Premiere cum Kick-off Ceremony of World AIDS Day 2012 was launched on 30 November. A Red Ribbon Concert 2012 was also organised by the Red Ribbon Centre targeting youths and the public on accepting and caring for infected people. Throughout the year, other promotional activities were conducted for different target audience, including ethnic minorities, cross-border travellers, drug users and clients of sex workers.

On capacity building and networking front, RRC supported the organization of a Report Back Seminar on the XIX International AIDS Conference hosted by the Advisory Council on AIDS. Dr Susan Fan, the ACA Chairperson and a multitude of speakers from the non-governmental organizations and Department of Health actively shared their experience gained from this Conference, held in US again after 22 years. In December, RRC also organized a MSM working group special meeting which was open to the MSM community, for brain-storming response to the escalating MSM epidemic. Last but not least, RRC Management Advisory Committee entered a new term in April 2012, with Dr Richard Tan being the new Chairman. We witnessed a record-high number of 514 reported infections in Hong Kong in 2012; it presented a formidable challenge ahead to RRC as well as all people engaged in or concerned about HIV response.



from Dr Richard TAN, Chairman of Red Ribbon Centre Management Advisory Committee

It is a great honour for me to be appointed as the Chairman of the Red Ribbon Centre (RRC) Management Advisory Committee (MAC) in April 2012. In the past year, the MAC has been working actively with the RRC to promote HIV prevention in the community.

Being the UNAIDS Collaborating Centre for Technical Support, one of the important tasks of RRC is to encourage experience exchange between relevant organizations both in HK and from abroad regarding HIV prevention and treatment. Last year, three HIV/AIDS professionals from different parts of the Mainland came to the RRC through the Lions Red Ribbon Fellowship Scheme for technical exchange. They had chances to understand the work of local NGOs via on-site visits, and at the same time learnt about the effectiveness of various HIV control and preventive measures implemented in different parts of China. All of them benefited a great deal from this sharing activity, which they found very useful for their work in the future.

In addition, RRC has put great effort into HIV prevention in HK. What strikes me most is the work targeting men who have sex with men (MSM) community. In response to the recent years of escalating HIV epidemic in the MSM community, RRC provided HIV/AIDS education as well as testing services in gay venues through various NGOs to raise MSM's awareness of HIV prevention. Apart from publicity and education work during large gay events such as the Hong Kong Lesbian and Gay Film Festival and Hong Kong Pride Parade, RRC also produced a gay friendly advertising clip and launched a new mobile application, hoping to widen the coverage of HIV/AIDS information. The increase of HIV testing rate in recent years among MSM community has proved the effectiveness of RRC's effort.

To reduce public misunderstanding of and discrimination against HIV/AIDS, and to increase the public's care and concern for those infected, RRC worked with Radio Television Hong Kong (RTHK) in last year to produce a number of radio programmes under the theme of "I Care, I Concern". Representatives of various organizations and doctors from the Department of Health were invited to discuss issues in this regard. Besides, a microfilm "Love, Zero AIDS" was also produced and put online. The film was well received by the public, and its

DVDs were distributed to various education institutions as teaching materials. In November last year, with the participation of several primary and secondary schools, a concert with the purpose of expressing care for people living with HIV was organized to provide a more comprehensive HIV/AIDS education. In that afternoon, the stadium was packed with audience and all were touched by the warm atmosphere.

The year 2012 marked the 15th anniversary of RRC's inception and Hong Kong's handover. A commemoration was held in the Red Ribbon Centre, with Mrs Regina Leung, the wife of the Hong Kong Chief Executive and the new Patron of RRC, Dr. Ko Wing Man, the Secretary for Food and Health, Dr. Constance Chan, the Director of Health, the former Chairman of MAC and representatives from other organizations as attending guests. During the ceremony, we revealed our hard work in the past 15 years, and were delighted to see people's rising awareness and understandings on HIV/AID. I believe that with passion and care, RRC will remain devoted to fight against HIV/AIDS, and continue to serve people of Hong Kong. We need your support!

Promotion of Awareness and Acceptance Activities

"I Care, I Concern", radio programmes

The Red Ribbon Centre collaborated with the Radio 2, Radio Television Hong Kong to launch a series of AIDS-related programmes. Under the theme - "I Care, I Concern", radio programmes focusing on issues about AIDS to help increase awareness were scheduled for broadcasting. Representatives from different sectors of the community were involved in the radio programme to promote HIV prevention, as well as care and support for people living with HIV.



Produce a MicroFilm titled "Love, Zero AIDS"

Jointly organized with Radio Television Hong Kong Radio 2, a MicroFilm titled "Love, Zero AIDS" was produced and a Premiere cum Kick-off Ceremony of World AIDS Day 2012 was launched on 30 November. RRC also launched MicroFilm "Love, Zero AIDS" online, which was well received and subsequently made into DVD as teaching materials for academic institutions.

The 9th AIDS Festival –Zero infection Zero discrimination

The Red Ribbon Centre actively participates in various promotional activities targeting the local ethnic minorities to raise their AIDS awareness. This year, the centre joined the 9th AIDS Festival under the theme of Zero Infection Zero Discrimination . The centre also held a booth to deliver HIV prevention and health messages to the ethnic minorities, and distributed a variety of education materials and souvenirs.



Capacity building and Networking activities

The XIX International AIDS Conference- Report Back Seminar was held on 7 September 2012. The purpose of the seminar is to let the conference attendees share with local AIDS workers the experiences and insights they had learned from the conference.





Red Ribbon Centre organized training workshops for NGO workers and health care workers to update their knowledge on HIV related issues, and introduce the services and resources of Red Ribbon centre





Red Ribbon Centre received visitors from the Mainland and overseas agencies, and provided a platform to enhance the collaboration between local workers and overseas counterparts in HIV prevention. There were totally 257 visitors in 2012







There were a total of three Lions Red Ribbon Fellows in 2012. The Fellowship Scheme is mainly aimed at experience sharing between Mainland China and local workers, to enhance technical exchange on HIV prevention, and encourage collaboration and networking.




